RESOLUTION NO. 55-07

Upon a motion by Representative Barrett and second by Representative Pemberton, the following was enacted:

WHEREAS, the Red Lake Tribal Council is the duly elected governing body of the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is interested in offering opportunities to Band members to harvest Band resources in a biologically sustainable manner; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The Red Lake Tribal Council hereby adopts the following Northern Pike Spearing Regulations, which supercede any prior resolutions and regulations to protect Northern Pike.

1. Northern pike may only be speared from the following streams:
 - a. Sandy Creek (Little Rock)
 - b. Pike Creek (Red Lake)
 - c. Mud Creek (Redby)
 - d. Sucker Creek and stream just west of Sucker Creek (Ponemah)
 - e. Red Lake River below the Red Lake Dam
2. The annual season shall be from April 1st to April 30th, between 5:00 pm and 10:00 pm daily.
3. Red Lake Band members, over the age of 60, may spear northern pike at anytime during the spearing season.
4. Only northern pike may be taken under theses regulations, however, rough fish (suckers, redhorse, and sheepshead) may be speared from the creeks and rivers of the Red Lake Reservation per Tribal Council Resolution No. 82-84.
5. There shall be a limit of 5 northern pike per person per day. There shall be a limit of 10 northern pike per vehicle per day (in instances where there are multiple parties sharing one vehicle). These limits shall also apply to northern pike taken from the Red Lake River west of the dam during the month of April.

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6. Once a limit of 5 northern pike is achieved, fishing shall cease. The discarding of unwanted fish "wanton waste" is prohibited by the Red Lake Game and Fish Code.
7. Only enrolled members of the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians may take fish, for personal use, under these regulations.
8. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult to engage in any spearing activity.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that these regulations will regulate the harvest of northern pike for subsistence purpose only.

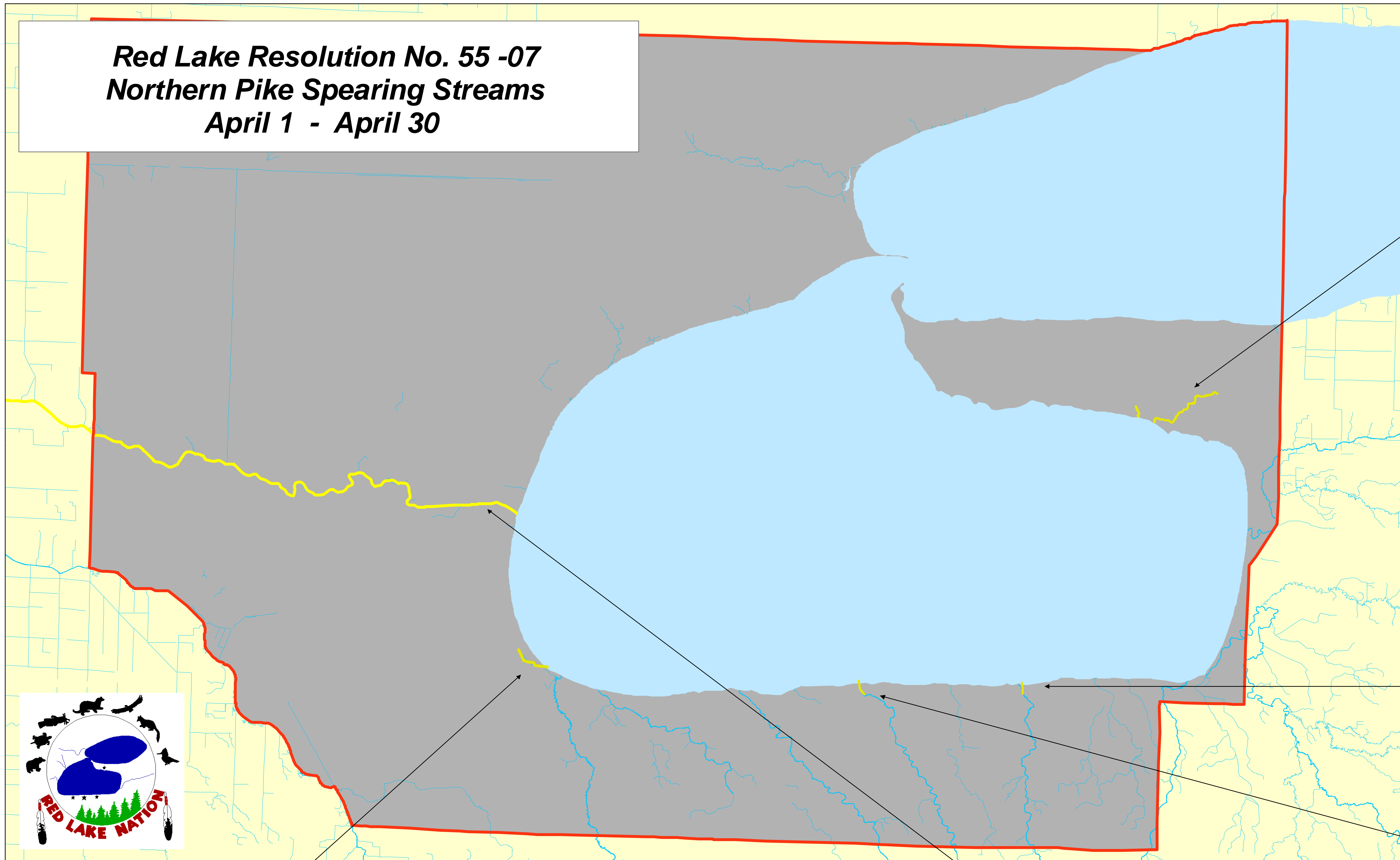

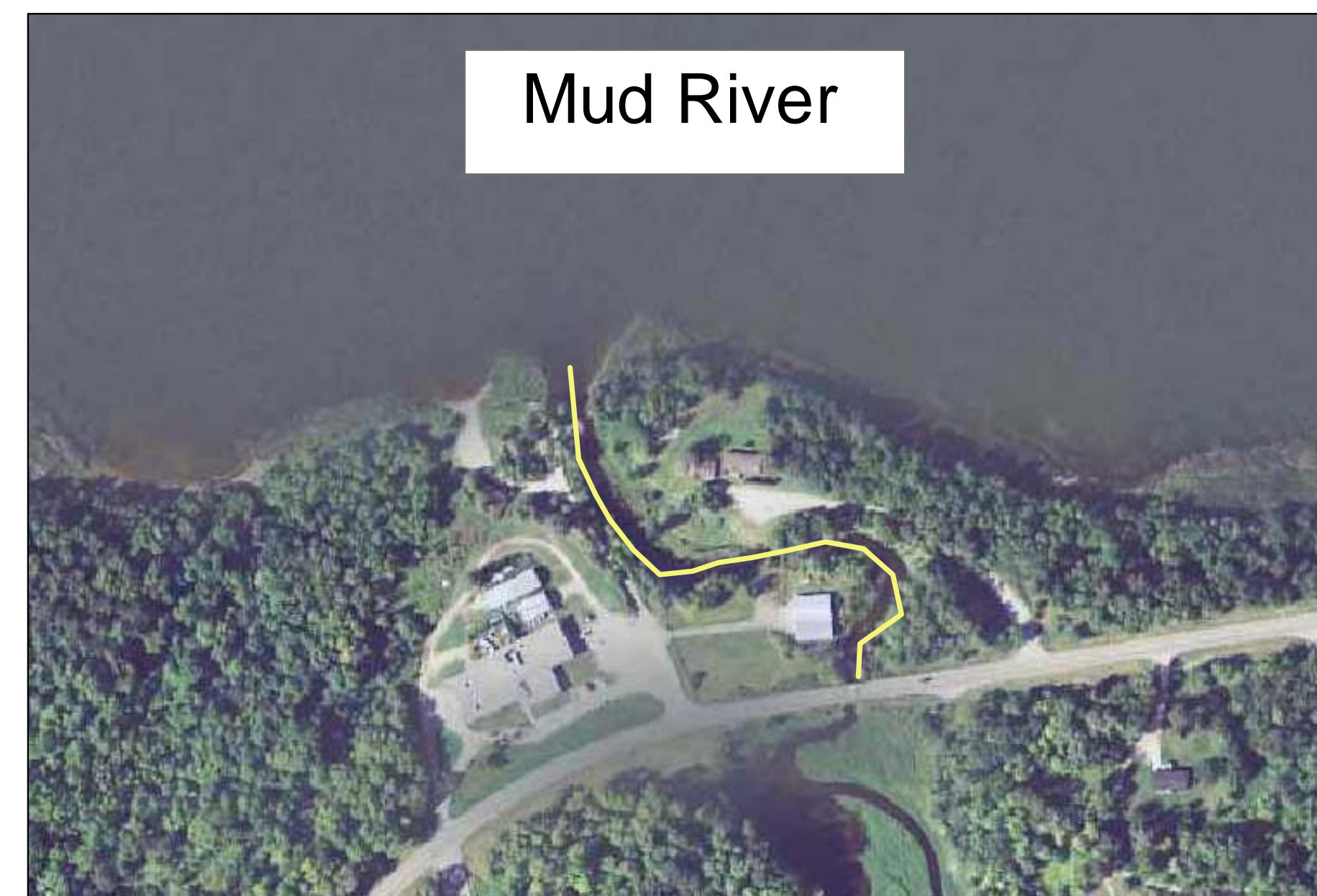

April 1 - April 30**



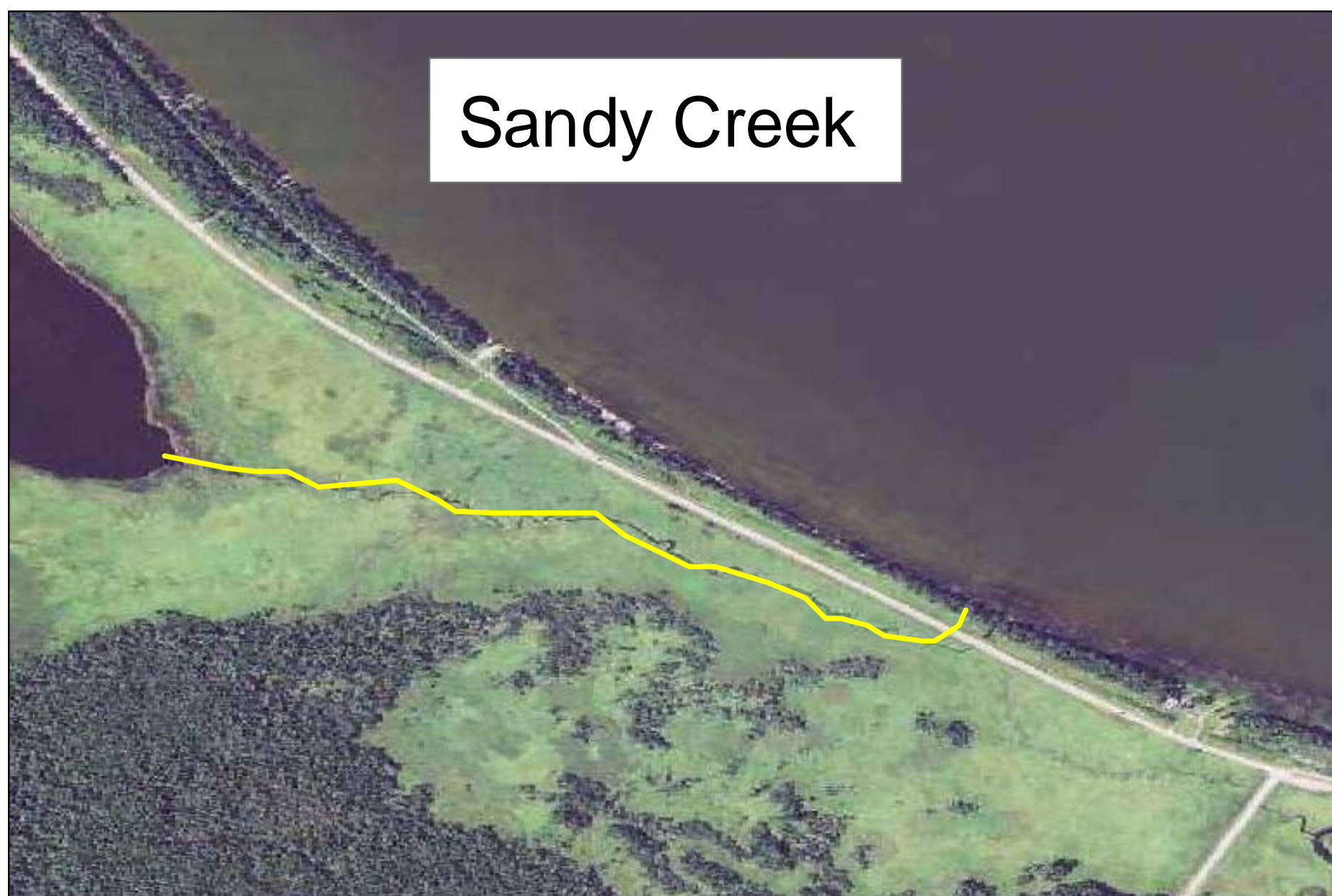
Sucker Creek and West Sucker Stream



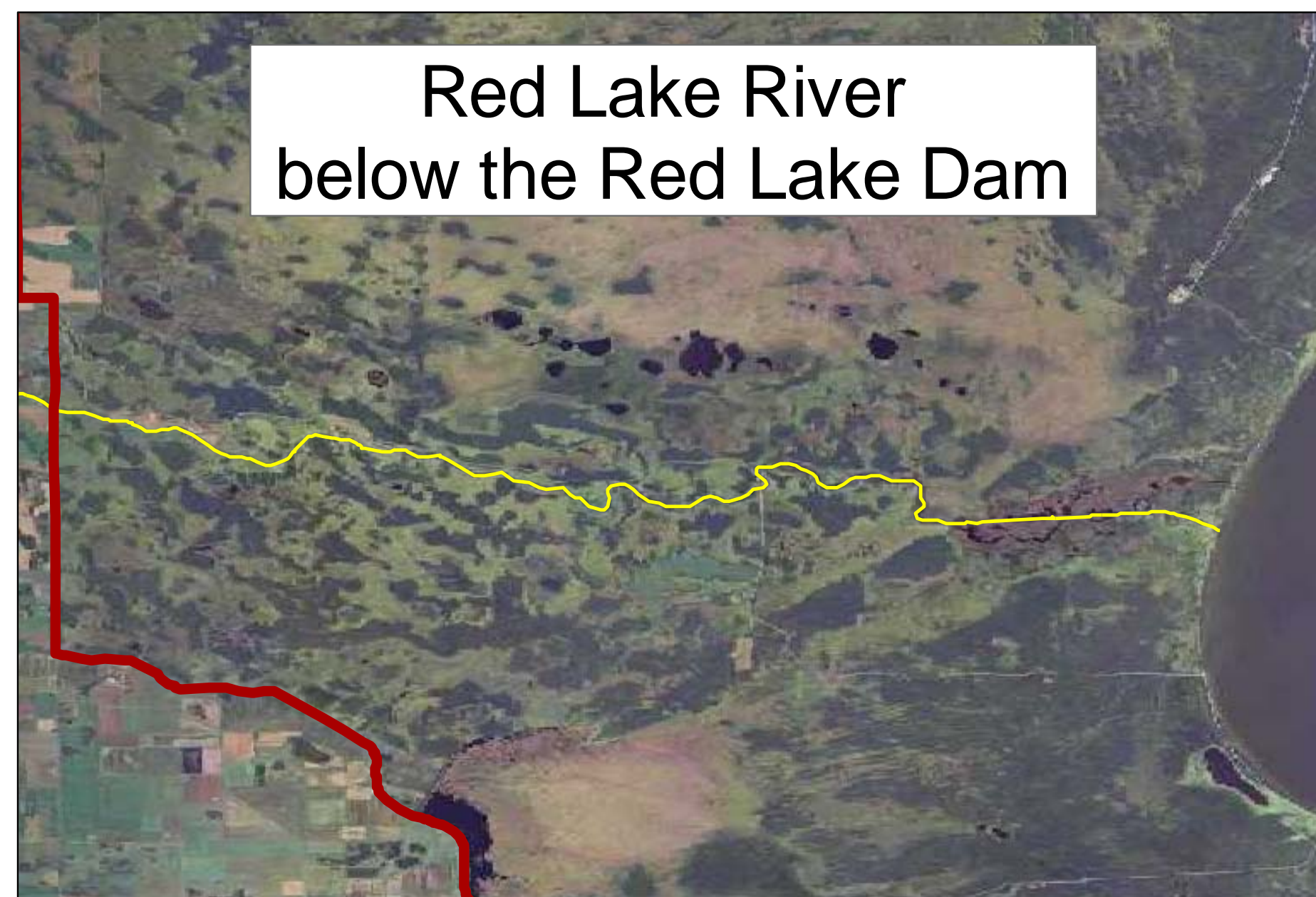
Mud River
